DREAM AWARD

An HTRS and ATHN Mentored Research Award

- The goal of the DREAM Award is to advance the care of patients with bleeding and clotting disorders by funding research in the field of hemostasis.
 - Research to use the national ATHNdataset
 - Young investigators to be mentored
 - ATHN-Affiliated HTC
 - Database research and statistics
 - Multi-center collaboration is encouraged





2018 Award



- Pre-proposals were due October 6, 2017 and are currently under review for invitation to submit full proposals
- Two grants of \$50,000 over 12 months or one grant of \$100,000 over 24 months, will be awarded to begin July 1, 2018
- Primary mentors must be established clinicians, epidemiologists, or related researchers working in hemostasis at an U.S.-based, ATHNaffiliated HTC
- Second mentors should be experienced in dataset research/ statistical analysis
- Supported by an educational grant from Shire





Evaluation Criteria 2018 Award

- Advances Career
- Qualified mentor
- Appropriate research environment
- Clear roles of applicant and mentors
- Timely and relevant topic



- Rationale and aims clear
- Use of ATHNdatasaet reasonable
- Feasible within timeline
- Realistic budget
- Appropriate statistical plan

- A new research opportunity for nurses, social workers, and other members of the HTC interdisciplinary care team.
- The CARE Award will give recipients the chance to use the power of real-world data in the ATHNdataset to answer research questions and ultimately, drive improvements in patient care.

The ATHN CARE Award is designed to:

- Advance knowledge in hemostasis by funding investigatorinitiated research or to test quality metrics and intervention strategies conducted by nurses and other members of the interdisciplinary team under the guidance of experienced mentors
- **Transform the care of patients** with bleeding and clotting disorders through the use of the national ATHNdataset.
- Provide career enrichment for nurses and other members of the interdisciplinary HTC team dedicated to the field of hemostasis disorders



Award Summary

- The ATHN CARE Award is a competitive award, with scientific review by an ATHN Research Review panel under the auspices of the ATHN Research Committee.
 - David Rushlow, Leslie Raffini, Chris Guelcher (Chair), Michelle Witkop, Heidi Lane, Stacy Croteau, Shannon Carpenter
- A pre-proposal process is used to test responsiveness to eligibility requirements, technical feasibility as proposed and scientific integrity
- Eligible applicants are nurses, advanced practice providers (NP/PA), social workers, physical therapists, genetic counselors or other member of the interdisciplinary team at ATHN affiliate HTC.
- Funding up to \$50,000 per recipient for projects lasting up to one-year.



2017 CARE Award Highlights

- 10 Mentors
- Multidisciplinary Review Panel (3 MD, 1 SW, 2 NP, 1 PT)
- 2 Awards of \$50,000 each awarded!

ATHN Data Quality Counts Grants to HTCs since 2008

- Support data management at HTCs
- Improve the ATHNdataset
- Increase data quality



Project Activities

- Secure patient authorizations for the ATHNdataset
- Enter complete core data elements for those patients who have been authorized (during this cycle and previously)
- Participate in ATHN Data Matters, ATHN's data quality assurance program



Wide HTC Participation

- 97 HTCs have received funding (2008 2017)
- Many HTCs have received funding for multiple years
- 37 HTCs are receiving funding this for 2017-2018

- HTCs must submit an application for the DQC grant.
- An objective review panel reviews the applications
